ALBERTA DOWNS (AD) was encouraged by HORSE RACING ALBERTA, ROCKY MOUNTAIN TURF CLUB and ASHA to build ADs Racetrack. The entire Alberta Standard bred industry relied on ALBERTA DOWNS for THEIR LIVELY HOOD.

ALLEN'S TROUT FARM INC. (Est 1961) was sold for \$5,000,000 & all the funds were used to build the ALBERTA DOWNS FACILITY. Also we had to supplement the operating expenses from many of our auction sales that we had over the years to survive.

Events that led to Alberta Downs Closure

1. 2008 - TRACK OPERATED BY ROCKY MOUNTAIN CLUB LIC.

Alberta Downs Initially operated the track under Rocky Mountain Turf Club race license temporarily with a further 10 year license renewal clause, among other provisions. RMTC, ASHA and HRA all agreed to provide Alberta Downs with a signed Long term Race License. ADs then became the primary 'A' Circuit Standardbreds Harness Track in Alberta when Stampede Park closed. When the racing licenses was signed, Alberta Downs committed it's whole future effort to racing and feel that Horse Racing Alberta signed a contract to ensure that we were solvent.

2. 2008 - PURCHASED 147 ACRES OF LAND AT LACOMBE

To get a building permit and zoning, Horse Racing Alberta, Alberta Downs and Rocky Mountain Turf Club had to sign a contract with the County of Lacombe to pay for a paved access service road (RR27-2) and traffic lights (at the time, it was to be over 1.5 million dollars) Alberta Downs was to pay installments over a number of years. This resulted in a LEIN being registered against property of Alberta Downs.

3. 2008 & 2009 - BUILT TRACKS, BARNS, GRANDSTANDS, ETC.

This resulted in a large capital investment and a lengthy approval process with Horse Racing Alberta that culminated with the long term race license. Among other provisions, the racing license agreement obligated Horse Racing Alberta ("HRA") to provide an operating grant to Alberta Downs on an annual basis to assist in funding the racetrack operations. This follows from Horse Racing Alberta's overriding obligations to the Government of Alberta (under the HRA/GOA agreement) to preserve and promote horse racing in Alberta. Top qualified bookkeepers and management were hired, that were all approved by HRA.



4. 2014 - HRA SEIZED OUR OFF TRACK SITES, and advised us by a letter that our home market area with off-track betting sites was to be taken over on January 1st, 2015 by United Horsemen of Alberta and Century Downs, a foreign company. The sites cost us thousands of dollars to setup and forced us to lay off our staff. We were never offered compensation for our investment and were never told why this happened without cause. Alberta Downs was further entitled to the proceeds from on and off-track betting receipts in its exclusive area, being a fifty-kilometre radius of its facility. What is unique in this arrangement is that the licensing arrangement consists of an agreement with mutual covenants by both parties, rather than a simple patent of authority issued by Horse Racing Alberta under their governing legislation. HRA never did give Alberta Downs sufficient operating funds that were promised to pay for the track expenses, upgrades & conditions needed to support "A" circuit harness racing. For instance, we experienced many unexpected expenses in 2014. The standardbred races ran one month longer than the contract agreement causing us to exceed our operating grant.

Alberta Downs also paid Northlands Park \$50,000 in November of 2015 for it's Post Time Tele-theater in Red Deer that was in our home market area. At that time, Northlands Park sat on the HRA Board and later after we paid this purchase fee, they voted to shut us down. This is a severe conflict of interest and a very corrupt practice.



5. 2015 - RACES CANCELLED BY HRA

On November 27th, 2014 Horse Racing Alberta advised Alberta Downs that it would NOT be awarded race days for the 2015 racing season. This despite just two weeks earlier, Alberta Downs attended an industry meeting where the draft race schedule had been agreed on granting us 22 Harness race days with 4 thoroughbred cards for the 2015 season. Alberta Downs hired a lawyer for breach of contract and HRA counsel replied with many conditions and said they would consider giving races if the conditions were met. HRA could have moved the stewards down to the main floor temporarily wagering while it was being fixed, but they declined. Alberta Downs did complete the conditions on their time line and Horse Racing Alberta still refused us race days for 2015 when Century Downs opened.

6. 2016 - RACES CANCELLED

On January 6th, 2016 an application to Horse Racing Alberta for 29 racing days if Alberta Downs agreed to pay all expenses and recruited the horses. Horse Racing Alberta then terminated the Alberta 2016 race meet after only six days of racing giving no reason. Horse Racing Alberta did not fulfill their commitment outlined in the 2016 Thoroughbred Racing Agreement. At the same time, we had a simulcast contract to sell our races to Gulfstream track in the USA. With six days of racing, Alberta Downs was wagering from \$25,000 to \$50,000 per race, higher than any other Alberta Track. Then the Canadian Pari-Mutuel Agency stepped in and stopped the USA from betting into our mutual pools, stating that Alberta Downs was classified as a foreign track even though the track was in Canada. HRA did not step up to help us, instead they cancelled our races that Horse Racing Alberta had approved. These decisions caused a LOSS of 40 plus jobs, resulting in sudden job terminations of race officials, jockeys, etc. (some have had to get social assistance). Our local feed supplier closed and there were over 200 race horses with their staff that had to be relocated. In addition, local dedicated fans had to be turned away.

7. 2017 - RACE DAYS REFUSED

Alberta Downs applied for an 18 race day season and was refused again. Horse Racing Alberta denied race days and operating grants to Alberta Downs, despite its obligations under the general licensing agreement with Alberta Downs for 10 years and an ongoing 10 years.

8. 2016 - FORECLOSURE BY LACOMBE COUNTY

On November 1, 2016 the Court of Queen's Bench of Alberta granted Alberta Downs six months to bring the access road arrears owing into good standing. Alberta Downs was unable to pay because HRA terminated Alberta Down's races cutting off our only income. Lacombe County commenced foreclosure proceedings and issued a notice of foreclosure on Alberta Downs lands and we were forced to sell the track.

9. 2017 - HRA CANCELLED RACING LICENSE

On the grounds that we no longer owned the land that was foreclosed on, HRA cancelled Alberta Downs racing license. This, despite Horse Racing Alberta allowing United Horsemen of Alberta to hold a race licence for several years without conducting races (on the site of Century Downs Calgary).



The lawyers opinion is as many as 8 out of 10 of the board members are in conflict for various reasons as a result of the financial advantages or other benefits, such as decisions that would bring to them personal gain. Over the past 60 years, I have observed the board members who had their own interests at heart, making decisions on racing and most of them to date have failed. The civil servants come and go with limited experience.

When our legal counsel reviewed all the material that we have maintained over the past years, their opinion is Alberta Downs Inc. has a very good case to sue for damages, plus compensation and possible criminal charges. Horse Racing Alberta has not only breached its authoritative powers by the actions taken against Alberta Downs but additionally is in breach of its contractual obligations to Alberta Downs which give rise to a claim for compensatory damages.

HRA RACETRACK GRANTS & STATS

In 2014, Alberta Down's operating grant was \$1,227,946 for 54 race days averaging \$22,739 per race day (the lowest of all tracks). The next year in 2015, Century Downs opened with the same horses and received a \$7,715,144 operating grant, plus \$1,000,000 discretion project grant for 84 days averaging \$103,751 per race day.

Alberta Downs track grants were never in line with other tracks even though we ran "A" circuit harness horses. Alberta Downs required operating grants and off-track betting income that was consistent with the other tracks to be viable. Among other provisions, the RLA obligated Horse Racing Alberta ("HRA") to provide an operating grant to Alberta Downs on an annual basis to assist in funding the racetrack operations. This obligation follows from Horse Racing Alberta's overriding obligations to the Government of Alberta (under the HRA/GOA agreement) to preserve and promote horse racing in Alberta.

Alberta Downs ran 3,299 races over 9 years (2009 to 2017) and ran first class race meets. HRA planned our track closure by putting us out business and giving no explanations. HRA started finding issues in 2015 when Century Downs race track opened.

Horse track plans embraced in Lacombe

LACOMBE — Plans for a new race track received overwhelming approval at an open house on Tuesday.

Property owner Robert Allen of Calgary and Max Gibb, CEO of the Rocky Mountain Turf Club in Lethbridge, laid out plans to build a \$12million to \$15-million horse racing centre on a quarter-section of land located east of Hwy 2 and south of Hwy 12, just inside town limits.

Investors in the project would lease the land from Allen, who used to own and operate the Trout Springs

race track at Calgary.

Gibb and Allen said they were surprised to see a crowd of about 100 at the meeting. Everyone they spoke to seemed to be in favour of the proposal. The only concern Gibb heard was from a resident worried about dust control. He said the road would be

"Wonderful," said Lacombe resi-

facturer Barry Black, a sponsor and member of Dave Bensmiller's chuckwagon racing team, said he expects the new track will bring a huge economic benefit to Central Alberta.

An officer with the World Professional Chuckwagon Association, Black said Gibb and his crew at Rocky Mountain Turf are known for


running a good show.

"I think they're just princes to work with. Every year we roll into Lethbridge with the chuckwagons and we deal with Max Gibb and his people, and it's a first-class operadent Gwen Jones. who expects to spend a lot of time at the track with her children when they come to watch the races.

Horse Racing Alberta Announces Off – Track Betting Decision

After a lengthy review which began in June 2014 by an industry evaluation committee and the Strategic and Sustainable Development Committee, the Board of Horse Racing Alberta announced today a split model for the Off Track Betting/Simulcast operation for the province of Alberta.

Northlands Park was awarded all OTB outlets north of Red Deer, while Century Casino/ Mr. Max Gibb (Newco) will operate all outlets south of Red Deer including Red Deer utilizing the area codes 780 (north) and 403 (south) as the dividing line.

The detailed process included an Expression of Interest phase that was reviewed and evaluated by an external industry advisory committee. The process then moved to a detailed Request For Proposal process resulting in an external industry committee making recommendations to the HRA Strategic and Sustainable Business Committee.

The Committee's recommendations were then presented and approved by the Board of Horse Racing Alberta.

In response to your Business Plan to operate Off Track Betting in your Home Market Area, the present OTBs operating in the Red Deer Market are grandfathered, and as such, will remain with their present operators. You may open other sites in the Red Deer Market.

The following requirements must be met prior to opening OTBs in your Home Market Area:

You must have a Horsemen's Agreement with a recognized Horsemen's Association; approval from CPMA and HRA; and as per your Business Plan, a letter of engagement with Jim Reid (Company name - Alberta Teletheatre Group) to provide services to include installing OTB equipment, obtain track contracts, do settlements and secure decoders.

Re: Race Dates for 2016 Racing Season

You have request that Horse Racing Alberta grant race dates for the running of certain thoroughbred horses at Alberta Downs.

After due consideration, HRA will grant the requested 22 days of racing as follows:

Alberta Downs may operate a 22-race racing season at its race track at or near Lacombe, AB (the "Race Track") along the following schedule:

June 5, 12, 19, 26 – 4 days July 3, 10, 17, 24, 31 – 5 days August 7, 14, 21, 28 – 4 days September 4, 11, 18, 25 – 4 days October 2, 9, 16, 23, 30 – 5 days

Post times for June, July and August shall be at 3:15 PM. Post times for September and October shall be at 2:15 PM.

It is understood by the parties that HRA shall not provide any financial contribution for any costs of racing at the Race Track, including but not limited to purses or staff. HRA will invoice Alberta Downs for the General Fee and Promotional Levy, to be paid by ABD to HRA 30 days from the date of invoice. Alberta Downs will ensure HRA receives continuous totalisor communication directly from AmTote Canada Inc. and any other tote provider operating at the Race Track during the Racing Season.

This granting of race days, however, is also conditional upon Alberta Downs honoring upon the terms of the a 10-year Class "B" Race Track License, commencing on the 22nd day of March, 2012 in accordance with the Rules (the "License"), such License having continued to run unabated.

CORPORATE OFFICE

This granting of race days is also conditional upon Alberta Downs strictly adhering to the following terms and conditions at all times during this Racing Season:

- (a) compliance with all laws, regulations, and any lawful direction of relevant provincial or federal agencies including but not limited to the *Horse Racing Alberta Act*, the *Rules Governing Horse Racing in Alberta* and the *Race Track Licensing Rules* and those pertaining the Canadian Pari-Mutuel Agency;
- (b) only permitting horses to run at the Race Track that:
 - i. have approval to race from the Southern Alberta Community Track Racing Association ("ACTRA");
 - ii. have a notarized bill of sale to an HRA-licensed owner for each U.S. horse to be raced at the Race Track;
- iii. have an HRA-licensed and registered trainer (for each horse) to be raced at the Race Track;
- iv. would not race at Grande Prairie during the 2016 horse racing season;
- (c) ensuring a duly executed contract with ACTRA to identify Southern Alberta horses and manage the purse monies is in place at all times during the Racing Season, a copy of which is to be delivered to HRA;
- (d) hiring all personnel required as per the *Rules Governing Horse Racing in Alberta*, including but not limited to two race judges, one security and track veterinarian for each race day;
- (e) ensuring the all Race Track facilities are in safe and proper condition.

Please indicate Alberta Downs' agreement to these terms and conditions by duly executing a copy of this Letter Agreement and returning an original copy to HRA. In so doing, Alberta Downs accepts that any breach of any of these conditions may result in the cancellation of any race day of the Racing Season without prior notice. We look forward to an excellent Racing Season.

Alberta Downs applying for 18 race days for the 2017 season to run on Sundays and Mondays, Post time 1;15 pm. Entries Fridays

We are asking for B Circuit purses minimum 8 races per day and daily operating grants par to RMTC and Evergreen Park. ATCRA will handle disbursement of purses

Staff is in place, Jockeys / gate crew are from NP and we have arranged for a commission Vet. AD has contracts with International Sound (photo finish). Amtote (tote),

Alberta Downs is in danger of losing our track to the County of Lacombe. This is caused from the agreement I made with the county before construction to pay for the paving of the access road. The Slots did not come but agreement stayed, which is now \$420,000 plus 24% interest per year. Under that County agreement we are only allowed to run horse racing on this property. When HRA refused to give us race days and operating funds we were unable to generate funds. To top it off the Alberta Government has quarantined all trout farms in Calgary area from selling fish. Their reason is they found diseased fish in the Bow River basin. This cut the only other income we had.

HRA encourage this track to be built. It cost us almost \$8,000,000 and we dedicated 10 years of our lives to this venue. The Alberta slot handle has doubled and all the other tracks got operating grant increases. Alberta Downs serves a vital service to racing in Central Alberta. We imported 140 well bred race mares into the province in 2016 and our handle over the years is higher than the other two B Circuit tracks.

No racing has put us in a serious situation and appreciate if HRA would give us these race days. The County will accept \$50,000 yearly payments for the road.



In that letter, we explained the hardship HRA is putting Alberta Downs through by refusing dates and viewing HRA financials the small funds we are asking for would not have a negative impact on the industry. We have provided first class racing both Thoroughbred and Harness to Central Alberta for six years wagering more than any other B circuit track.

If HRA cannot award the above, we will have no alternative but to take another course of action. We have been advised that there are three directions that can be pursued, Mediation, Arbitrator or Legal action in court

We have dedicated our whole life to racing and can't understand why we are treated like an Enemy. Alberta Downs did nothing wrong to hurt the Racing Industry. HRA letters has never given a reason for refusing race dates and taking our home market area away. (given it to Century Downs)

Alberta Downs will fight to the end to get our racing business back and would appreciate if this application be addressed again.



Background of R.O. Allen

Owned and currently operating Allen's Trout Farm in Calgary, Alberta. The farm is surrounded by a 36-hole golf course and million dollar houses. Established in 1961, celebrating our 54th year of continuous stocking of lakes and ponds of live rainbow trout in Alberta.

Owned and operated Happy Valley Recreations, Calgary, Alberta featuring an 18 hole golf course, a large amusement area with Olympic size indoor swimming pool, a 1,000 stall RV and tenting park. Happy Valley Recreations was sold in 1979 for housing development.

Operated the Cave Night Club, Vancouver, BC, established in 1937 and was replaced by a 37 story bank tower in 1981. Some of the best acts in the world played there. Roy Orbison, Bette Midler, BB King, Village People, Sonny and Cher, Wayne Newton, Johnny Cash, Mitzi Gaynor Chuck Berry, Tina Turner, Louis Armstrong, Frank Sinatra and many more. The Club was a big stepping stone to playing Las Vegas.

Alberta Downs constructed it's first race track in Calgary, in 1981 and it sold in 1998 for a housing and golf course development. We were the first track to provide simulcasting in Alberta and an all-weather sawdust racetrack.

In 2006, Alberta Downs commenced a new racetrack operation in Lacombe, Alberta which has a 1 mile dirt all-weather track and a 7/8 mile turf allowing us to run thoroughbred and harness racing on the same card.
